Michigan Aging and Disability Needs Assessment YOUR VOICE "NEEDS" TO BE HEARD!!!

For the first time since 1987, the State of Michigan is conducting a statewide needs assessment of Michigan residents. Think about all of the changes in the last 25 years with technology, health care and services. The Michigan Office of Services to the Aging and the Isabella County Commission on Aging need your help in letting us know about your life and your needs to help us plan for how future needs might be met.

We are asking people over the age of 50, and those over the age of 18 with disabilities to help us by completing the needs assessment. The survey takes approximately 20 minutes to complete. It can be accessed in the following ways:

Paper copies of the Needs Assessment will be available at the Isabella County Commission on Aging main office at 2200 South Lincoln Road, Mt. Pleasant, and at all the COA Nutrition Sites in Isabella County. All surveys are anonymous. When you have completed the assessment, you can either mail the survey back to the address provided on the survey or you can return it to the Isabella County Commission on Aging, and we will deliver it to the state. All surveys are due back to the state by July 31, 2012.


The needs assessment will ask questions about housing, employment, transportation, access to health care, social support, community services and finding information. Your answers will be confidential. The results will be analyzed and reported back to the State Office of Services to the Aging by an independent evaluation company. The information will be used to inform state and local leaders, policy makers and program planners. We will compile and report results for Michigan as a whole, and also prepare local results for each individual county. The Isabella County Commission on Aging is asking all eligible individuals in our county to complete the needs assessment. We want to send a message to the state to let them know Isabella County is participating in this survey and that we care about the future of our older population.

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Director's Comments Brenda J. Upton, M.A., COA Executive Director



Funding, funding, funding . . . is there anything I talk about as much as out funding at the Commission on Aging? Well, to be honest, NO . . . I do talk about our funding situation more than anything else.

It's not my most favorite subject, but it is the most important part of my responsibilities as Director of the agency. If I and our Program Coordinators didn't place "funding" as a priority we wouldn't have any programs to offer.



So it is important that we monitor our funding to make sure our services remain strong.

The chart you see above illustrates the variety of our funding sources. Everyone one of them is important, and is vital to our operations. The following is a description of each category:

2% Miscellaneous – This money comes from our fund raising activities; Our Annual Golf Outing and our Meals-on-Wheels Walk-a-thon, which are both sponsored by Friends of Isabella Seniors.

3% In-Kind- This isn't actually cash, but it is support required by our State and Federal Grants. Examples of an in-kind for our Foster Grandparent Program are the meals some of the schools provide to our Grandparents when they are volunteering at the schools. The schools provide the meals at no cost to the grandparents or our program and we can count it as "a gift in kindness given".

7% Gratiot Millage- We manage the Home Delivered Meals and Congregate Meals Programs in both Isabella and Gratiot Counties. The budgets for these programs and for each of the counties are separate. Only funding for Gratiot County is spent in that county and only funding for Isabella County is spent here. The Gratiot County Millage dollars are therefore given to us to spend on their nutrition program. By having us manage both programs in both counties we cut down on administrative costs which allows us to spend more on direct services in both counties.

9% Client Donations- This funding comes directly from our program participants. One of the requirements for our grant funded programs is that we "ask" for donations from the individuals we serve. If a client is unable to donate we will still serve them and give them as much assistance as we can. We do not charge for our grant funded services and we do not deny a service if a client cannot donate.

6% Waiver- Through the Medicaid Waiver, eligible adults who meet income and asset criteria can receive Medicaid-covered services like those provided by nursing homes, but can stay in their own home or another residential setting. This is a program restricted by certain eligibility guidelines. It is not administered by the Commission on Aging, but the Waiver Agents contract limited services through our agency.

3% NSIP- The Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP) are Federal dollars the COA receives based on the number of meals we serve in both our Home Delivered and Congregate Meals Program. The amount received changes from year to year based on the number of meals we serve. It can range from .40¢ to .55¢ per meal.

12% OSA- Office of Services to the Aging is Michigan's State Unit on Aging. We contract directly with them for the funding we receive to manage our Foster Grandparent and Senior Companion Programs.

14% AAA- Region VII Area Agency on Aging receives funding from OSA and then contacts with the Isabella County Commission on Aging to provide funding for our Nutrition Programs and our In-Home Services Programs.

19% Saginaw Chippewa Tribe- The funding the COA receives from the Tribal Council has been a vital part of our budgets since 1995. Their generous support demonstrates the honor in which they hold the elders of our entire community. The Tribal Councils support is used in every direct service the COA provides.

25% Isabella Millage- In November, 2006 the voters of Isabella County passed, for the first time, a Senior Millage. The funding generated by this millage is being used to provide services to our older citizens throughout Isabella County. Prior to 2006 are local support came out of the County's General Fund. When the millage went into affect we no longer received General Fund dollars. Over the years we have seen our State and Federal funding diminish. It has been because of our Senior Millage funding and the funding from the Saginaw Chippewa Tribe that we have been able to sustain our programs and services. We are very grateful for the support of our entire community.

County Parks & Recreation Millage Fact Sheet Please Remember to Vote on Tuesday August 7, 2012

Funding

Since 1967 Isabella County Parks & Recreation Commission has provided County-wide park services. The budget challenges the County is facing have affected the funding support for Parks and Recreation operations. Establishing a solid funding source will allow the Parks and Recreation Commission to better maintain and improve the County Parks so future generations will be able to enjoy these recreational areas.

County Parks Millage Request

On Tuesday, August 7, 2012 Isabella County voters will be asked to vote on a 6-year, Parks Millage, up to .35 mills for the purpose of operating, maintaining and improving County Park facilities and program offerings. The tax rate will generate up to \$ 567,963.

PROPOSAL: For the purpose of operating, maintaining and improving the Isabella County Parks and Recreation Commission parks and programs as provided by PA 261 of 1965, shall the Constitutional limitation upon the total amount of taxes which may be assessed in one (1) year upon all property within the County of Isabella, Michigan, be increased by up to 0.3500 of one (1) mill, (\$0.35 per \$1,000 of Taxable Value), for a period of six (6) years, 2012-2017, inclusive?

If approved and levied in full, this millage will raise an estimated \$567,963 for the Isabella County Parks and Recreation Commission parks and programs in the first calendar year of the levy. In accordance with State law, a small portion of the millage may also be disbursed to the Downtown Development Authorities of the Cities of Clare, Mt. Pleasant, and Union Township; the Local Development Finance Authority of the City of Clare; the Tax Increment Finance Authorities of the City of Mt. Pleasant; and the Brownfield Redevelopment Authority of Mt. Pleasant.

Ask a COA Specialist

What is the difference **Question:** between adult foster care homes and assisted living facilities?

Answer: In Michigan, adult foster care homes (AFCH) are licensed and regulated by the state. "Assisted Living" is used as a marketing term in Michigan. Because the term is not legally defined in Michigan any operation regardless of the services they may or may not provide may call themselves an "Assisted Living Facility". Many AFCH are now marketing themselves as assisted living.

Residents appropriate for both types of long term care facilities are unable to live independently due to physical or mental deficits, but do not need the continuous nursing care found in nursing homes. A listing of adult foster care homes, assisted living facilities and nursing homes in Isabella County is available from the Commission on Aging.

Safe Travels By Lisa Cross, CMCHD Health Educator

Are you planning a summer or fall trip? Following are a few tips to ensure safer. more pleasurable travels.

Vaccinations: Find out if you require any new or updated shots. Certain areas of travel require or recommend shots, especially travel overseas. Visit the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) web site at www.cdc.gov/travel, and click on your destination for required or recommended vaccines.

• Current medications: If you currently take medications and will be crossing time zones, check with your physician as to whether you should continue to take your medication based on your local time zone or the time zone you are traveling to. Also, pack your current medications in their prescribed bottles. This will expedite your time in customs. Carry all current medications in your carry on bag to avoid loss or damage.

• Guard against deep-vein thrombosis (DVT): Older adults run a higher-than-average risk of developing a DVT. This is especially true when sitting still for long periods of time on an airplane, train or in an automobile. Some research finds that wearing "compression stockings" can help prevent this dangerous condition.

• Water consumption: Drink plenty of water on the plane, as the air inside a plane is dry and can promote dehydration.

• Prepare in advance: Talk with your travel agent to see if there are any restrictions or travel advisories for your vacation destination.

• Review your health plan: Review your current health plan before travel. Are you covered by your health insurance while in your vacation destination?

Gift certificates can be used at any of our five Isabella County sites in Mt. Pleasant, Rosebush, Weidman, Winn, and Shepherd. Separate gift certificates can also be purchased for use at our Gratiot County Sites in Breckenridge, Ithaca, Fulton, Sumner, and St. Louis. Gift certificates can be purchased for \$2.50 per meal at the Commission on Aging office or at any of our meal sites.

Golden Age Cards

If you are age 85 or older, you are eligible to receive a Golden Age Card, compliments of the Isabella County Transportation System. This will enable you to ride the *IRide* bus for free. This card is made at the COA Activity Center, 2200 S. Lincoln Rd. in Mt. Pleasant. You will need to show verification of your age and be a resident of Isabella County to obtain a pass.
