Ask a COA Specialist

Question: Every year I come home for the holidays to find my sister acting upset and angry with me. Mom was diagnosed with dementia approximately three years ago, and my sister has been her primary caregiver since then. I appreciate all my sister is doing for mom and would like to help when I am here. Since my sister always seems so upset, I don't know where to start.

Answer: I heard you say that you appreciate all that your sister is doing. Have you genuinely told your sister that? Not only did your mom's lifestyle change with her memory loss but, your sister's life *significantly* changed when she became her caregiver.

The holidays are a time of celebration, but can also be stressful for care recipients and caregivers. I would suggest you have a conversation with your sister. Let your sister express her frustrations and possible anger. We live in such a fast-paced world that we often don't take the time to stop and actually *listen* to what the other person is saying.

If you truly would like to provide some assistance to your sister, ask her ways in which you could help. You might be able to stay with mom while your sister gets a few hours away, or maybe hire a private care provider so you and your sister can share some time away from the situation. If you would like some other suggestions on ways to help, give us a call, and we can give you ideas on where to start. Even long distance relatives can help with care. giving.

While we were there, we had a boat ride on the Hudson River to view the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island and to see the skyline of Manhattan. Then we checked into our hotel and had dinner at a local restaurant. The three mornings we were there, we had breakfast at the Hard Rock Café across from Good Morning America right in Times Square. toured Radio City Music Hall and had a step- on guide board the motor coaches to give a tour as close to Ground Zero as possible, Battery Park and then back up town past Wall Street, 34th Street and up 5th Avenue. On our second night there we went to see a Broadway Play "Nice Work if you Can Get It" with Matthew Broderick and Kelly O'Hara. We laughed and enjoyed the music and costumes.

We had done so much and now had one day to do anything we wanted. Some rode the subway, visited Ground Zero to pay their respects, saw another play, went to visit a church, shopped, went to a museum, rode to the top of a tall building or took a cab ride. New York City is such a busy place with millions of people working and visiting every day. There were cabs everywhere. We were told most people who live there don't own a car but come to Manhattan Island by the ferry, cabs, subway and buses. They travel over bridges and through tunnels to get there.

As we were getting ready to leave I overheard a few our passengers say "Boy! I am glad we are leaving before the storm!" I thought to myself that we were lucky to have had such nice weather while we were there. I did not realize what was coming.

We said good-bye and glanced back to get our last look of New York City. Little did we know the lives of many were going to be so drastically changed after we left. It is hard to imagine that just three days later the tunnels would close, the subways would be flooded, and there would be darkness.

I am thankful we left when we did but have heard from so many that went on the trip how badly they feel for those who lost so much during Hurricane Sandy. How things can change so quickly when we least expect it!

Arthritis by Lisa Cross, Health Educator

Arthritis is a complex family of musculoskeletal disorders with many causes, not yet fully understood, so there are no cures. It is the leading cause of disability in the United States and the cost to the U.S. economy is \$128 billion annually.

There are five common forms of arthritis:

- Osteoarthritis (the most common), a progressive degenerative joint disease characterized by the breakdown of joint cartilage
- Rheumatoid arthritis, a systemic disease characterized by the inflammation of the membrane lining the joint, causing pain, stiffness, warmth, swelling and sometimes severe joint damage
- Gout, a buildup of uric acid in the body causing crystal-like deposits to travel to the joints, causing sudden, severe attacks of pain and tenderness, redness, warmth and swelling in the joint
- Lupus, a chronic inflammatory disease that can affect various parts of the body, especially the skin, joint, blood and kidneys
- Fibromyalgia, characterized by generalized muscular pain and fatigue

There are many treatment plans for arthritis including home remedies, nonprescription and prescription medications, joint injections and surgical procedures. For more information, talk with your primary care physician or contact the American Arthritis Foundation.


