

Director's Comments

Medicare Part D – Open Enrollment is Almost Here

In 2003 Congress passed, with bipartisan the Medicare support, Modernization Act. This Public Act put into place the Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Program. According to a recent article published by Forbes (8/9/13), this program has been one of the most cost-effective and successful programs run by the Federal government. It has helped over 6.6 million Older Adults across the country. This includes thousands throughout the mid-Michigan area. The article went on to say that Part D has saved over \$7 billion on prescription drugs, approximately \$1,000 per Medicare recipient. According to government statistics, 94% of Medicare recipients say they are satisfied with their drug coverage. It is apparent that Part D is successful. How many other Federal programs can say that their costs are 45% below the program's 10 year projection? It is a good program and it is a vital component in an individual's health care coverage.

Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage is available for all individuals with Medicare Part A and/or Part B, regardless of age, income or health conditions. It is your responsibility to enroll in Part D unless you already have creditable coverage. (This could mean that you are employed, and your employer provides prescription coverage.) When you become eligible for Medicare at the age of 65, you can enroll. You have a 7 month window of opportunity; the 3 months before you turn 65, the month you turn 65 or the 3 months after the month you turned 65. If you are under the age of 65, have a disability and are eligible for Medicare your window of enrollment is 3 months before your 25th month of disability or 3 months after your 25th month of disability. You would also have an opportunity to enroll when you reach the age of 65. In both cases, whether you are just turning 65 or you are disabled,

this would be considered your "initial enrollment period."

Medicare also has an annual "open enrollment period." In 2013 "open enrollment" will take place between October 15, 2013 and December 7, 2013. Any changes made in your Part D coverage during this time frame will go into effect January 1, 2014. The "open enrollment period" is the only time during the year that all individuals on Medicare can join or change their Part D prescription drug plan. Even if you like your current Part D plan, it is strongly recommended that you review your plan annually for the upcoming year. Your prescriptions may change. Your physician may have changed the type of drug you take or changed the dose. You may have stopped taking a particular drug. These changes could make a difference and your current plan may not be the best one for you anymore. There are currently 28 different prescription drug plans available in the State of Michigan. Many of those plans are offered by different drug companies. By reviewing your Part D plan annually, possibly you could save money by finding a plan that has lower premiums and fewer restrictions.

All this can be very confusing. If you would like help, you have some options available. Both the Isabella County Commission on Aging (989-772-0748) and the Gratiot County Commission on Aging (989-875-5246) have staff and volunteer counselors who will assist with the Part D enrollment process. All the staff and counselors receive extensive training before providing this service.

Again, the "open enrollment" period is from October 15 to December 7. Assistance in Isabella and Gratiot Counties is provided through the Commission on Aging (COA) in each county by appointment only. Beginning October 1 you can call your county COA and make your appointment. When you come for your appointment please remember to bring your Medicare card and all your current prescription bottles. The counselor needs to know not only the name of the drug(s) you



are taking, but the dosage and the frequency of the drugs you take. Enrollment assistance is available for county residents 60 years of age and older. If you are an Isabella County resident call the Isabella COA at 989-772-0748; Gratiot County residents call the Gratiot COA 989-875-5246.

If you live in one of the surrounding counties you can contact MMAP by calling **1-800-803-7174** or visit the MMAP web site www.mmapinc.org. They will direct you to a counselor in your area.

Last year the Isabella County COA assisted over 550 individuals with their Part D during the "open enrollment period." If you would like assistance please call. We will start taking appointments October 1 for this year's "open enrollment."

Ask a COA Specialist

Question: I have Medicare and am not sure how this will work with the Health Insurance Marketplace, what should I do?

Answer: If you have Medicare, you do not need to do anything. Your coverage will not be affected by the Health Insurance Marketplace. The Marketplace is ONLY for those who do not have any health coverage. Listed below are a few facts regarding the Health Insurance Marketplace. This will begin October 1 and last through March 31.

- 1. Uninsured people who enroll in a plan offered through the Marketplace may qualify for a tax credit to help pay for their plan.
- 2. The health plan Marketplace is designed to offer coverage including physician visits, maternity, hospitalization, ER visits and prescriptions.
- 3. Individuals who have pre-existing conditions cannot be denied coverage.
- 4. Individuals who are uninsured and do not choose a plan may face a penalty.

To learn more about the Health Insurance Marketplace you may visit HealthCare.gov or call 1-800-318-2596. If you are a Medicare recipient and want help reviewing your Medicare plan please feel free to call 1-800 Medicare, or the Commission on Aging at 989-772-0748. The annual Open Enrollment Period is from October 15 through December 7, and COA will start taking appointments on October 1. If you have other questions pertaining to insurance, please feel free to You will be transferred to the call anytime. Insurance hotline and a specialist will return your call within 5 business days. Sessions are available for Isabella County residents 60 years of age and older and are by Appointment Only. There is no cost for the session, although donations to the agency are welcomed.

Mrs. Candace Henderson will present "My Grandfather's Diaries 1938-40 - Remarks on the death of Isaiah Leebove and Mammoth Producing and Refining Corporation" on October 14, 2013, at the Shepherd Area Historical Society's Powerhouse Museum at 7 p.m. in Shepherd. The Mammoth Producing and Refining Corporation was rumored to have a connection to the Purple Gang who frequented the Doherty Hotel in Clare, Michigan. Attorney Isaiah Leebove was shot dead at the hotel on May 14, 1938, and Carl (Jack) Livingston was accused of his murder. Mr. Leebove, a successful New York City attorney, was at one time known as the mystery man of Michigan politics.

"KAISA"

Mt. Pleasant author Jack R. Westbrook has slated a book signing of his new historical novel for October 5 at the Zonta Applefest at Papa's Pumpkin Patch, 3099 South Summerton Road in Mt. Pleasant. Westbrook will be personalizing autographs of customer choice at the event for the new book as well as his previous eight titles. He will also autograph the novel with a major chain bookstore signing at the Midland Mall Barnes & Noble, Saturday, October 19, from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m.

"KAISA: A Novel of Michigan's Copper Mining & Oil and Gas Industries; Calumet, Mt. Pleasant, Holland, Mackinac Island and Jekyll Island, Georgia" is a 312 page historical romance/adventure novel. Named for a small Finnish girl who died in the Italian Hall tragedy during the copper miner's strike in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, "KAISA" follows two women of successive generations through Michigan events from 1913 to 1935. The 1928 discovery of the Mt. Pleasant oilfield, 1931 Struble well fire, 1934 start of the Michigan Oil and Gas Association and 1935 Michigan Oil and Gas Exposition at Mt. Pleasant are all detailed as key elements of the book. Other scenarios include Michigan's 1913 copper miner strike and the Italian Hall Tragedy at Calumet, the 1929 founding of Holland's Tulip Festival, life in a 1930s Mt. Pleasant and in a Mackinac Island East Bluff Cottage. Westbrook's first fiction book concludes with a 1942 Nazi U-Boat landing craft attempting to kidnap Governors of the U. S. Federal Reserve from a Jekyll Island, Georgia meeting, where the "Fed" was conceived thirty-two years before. Here Kaisa finds intrigue and love.
