



Director's Comments

As a part of the Affordability Care Act (ACA) we now have the Health Insurance Marketplace available. The Marketplace is designed to assist citizens in searching for and enrolling in a health insurance plan. They opened for business on October 1, 2013. Please note that there is a 6 month initial open enrollment period that runs from October 1, 2013, to March 31, 2014.

The question is: what does the Marketplace mean for older adults? The answer to that depends on your individual situation.

If you are 65 years or older and you have Medicare, you are protected from the mandated penalty

and you do not have to do anything. The Marketplace is for individuals under the age of 65 and uninsured, underinsured, or looking for more insurance options. It is illegal for someone to sell you a Marketplace plan if you already have Medicare Part A with no premiums and / or Part B.

The National Council on Aging has provided the following five tips to protect you during the Marketplace open enrollment season:

- 1. If something doesn't feel right, trust your instincts. When someone calls you on the phone claiming to be a government employee and needs to know your personal information, such as asking for your social security number or requesting credit card information.....stop! Government workers will not call you asking for you for this information. Do not give your personal information to someone you do not know, whether over the phone, by mail, or in person.
- 2. Keep your Medicare card and your Social Security card in a safe place, and keep them private.
- 3. Mailings and letters from the government, such as Medicare and Social Security will have official government seals and logos. Save these mailings, and if you question their authenticity save them and have someone you trust look at them. Do not respond unless you can verify they are legitimate.
- 4. If someone does call you and asks for your personal health or financial information, do not feel obligated to respond. Call them out; tell them you need to verify who they are representing. Ask them their name, number, address and the name of their company. Be a safe consumer and ask.
- 5. If you feel something is wrong, don't be shy, speak up and report it. For every reported fraudulent scam there are at least 10 scams that go unreported. You can report it to our local police, the State Consumers Protection Agency and even to the Federal Trade Commission. Protect yourself and help to protect others.

If you are between the ages of 55-64, uninsured or underinsured and do not have access to affordable health care you should review your options in the Marketplace. Depending on your income, you may get subsidies to help pay for your Marketplace plan premium and cost-sharing. You will also get screened for Medicaid eligibility.

The State of Michigan has set up a Marketplace website. It can be accessed through the State's website. There are a lot of people trying to access the website, so be patient and persistent; the Michigan Marketplace is a good place to start.

Answer: A Homeownership Counselor may be able to assist you. The counselor is trained by MSHDA, Michigan State Housing Development Authority to assist both individuals and families facing financial hardship, obtaining local resources or avoiding foreclosure. AARP Tax-Aides Needed

It may seem too soon to be thinking about doing your taxes, but our volunteers are already planning how they can better help you with your state and federal income tax returns. The Commission on Aging will continue to assist with this free service to our community.

If you're interested in helping your community and having fun while doing it, consider becoming a TaxAide Volunteer. Prior tax experience is not necessary, but it is helpful. You should be comfortable using a computer because the returns are prepared using a computer tax program. You will receive extensive training starting January 3 and will always have IRS approved materials and experienced volunteers available to work with you as reference sources. The tax preparation program is geared to prepare both state and federal income tax returns for middle and low-income people, with emphasis on those 60 or older. Tax return preparation will be scheduled from February 6 through April 9 at the Commission on Aging and various other sites in Isabella County. Volunteers typically work at the preparation sites 1 or 2 days a week.



Being Prepared for Emergencies By CMDHD

Stay Informed. Make A Plan. Build a Kit. Get Involved. *1* Four simple steps, recommended by the Ready campaign, can help you, your family and your community in the event of an emergency.

Stay Informed: Many websites offer information on a wide variety of topics surrounding emergencies/disasters. Helpful websites include: Ready Campaign (www.ready.gov), The Michigan Department of Community Health preparedness site (www.michigan.gov/prepares), American Red Cross (www.redcross.org) and Central Michigan District Health Department (www.cmdhd.org.). Sign up for local emergency alerts through Emergency Management and text PREPARE to 43362 (4FEMA) to receive monthly preparedness tips. (msg/data rates apply).2

Make a Plan: What is your family or business emergency plan? Do you have enough items to last for 3 days without power, if necessary? Plan for your pets and those with special medical needs.

Build a 3 Day Kit: Items may include: a flashlight and extra batteries; a battery powered radio and extra batteries; a first aid kit; a map of the area that indicates roadways and rivers, which may aid in evacuation; a compass; a whistle to signal for help; cash (ATM and banks may not work); a utility knife (no exposed blades); matches in a waterproof container; a change of clothes and a sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person; food (canned food and a can opener, dry food that will not expire); a gallon of water per person per day; pet food; prescription medications; copies of birth certificates, passports, licenses, and wills; and a list of phone numbers of relatives or emergency contacts. Create an emergency supply kit for your house, one that you can easily take with you if you have to evacuate and go to a shelter or a safe location; and one for your place of business.

Get Involved: Being involved is the last step to being prepared. Become involved in local efforts in your community by becoming a member of your local Citizens Corps (www.citizenscorps.gov). In Michigan, you can also become a registered volunteer through the Michigan Volunteer Registry (www.mivolunteerregistry.org.).
