Director's Comments

For the fifth year in a row the Commission on Aging was again the lucky recipient of the Daniel Breidenstein Living Memorial Auction, which took place Saturday, November 7. Lois Breidenstein, her family and the employees at The Bird Bar & Grill have organized and conducted an annual auction to benefit community service organizations for 28 years. We consider ourselves to be very fortunate to once again be selected and honored by the Breidenstein Family.



The Breidenstein Family and the employees of The Bird Bar and Grill do all the work. They contact a variety of community businesses and individuals and ask them if they would be willing to donate items that could be auctioned at their fund raiser. The auction started at 4:00 p.m. and finished at approximately 7:30 p.m. The Bird was packed with people. Nearly all of them participated either in the live auction and/or the raffles. It is easily the best time I have ever had at a fund raiser. And that is due to the fact that Lois, her family and her employees work hard at pulling the auction together and managing it throughout the evening. Everyone is guaranteed a good time.

The Commission on Aging is so very grateful to Lois Breidenstein, her family and her employees. It takes a lot of time and hard work to bring the auction together. We truly appreciate being the recipient of their efforts. This year's auction brought in \$9,675.00. Over the last five years The Bird Auction has generated over \$40,000.00 for the Commission on Aging. All of this funding has stayed right here in Isabella County and has been used to reimburse our volunteers for the mileage they have generated when delivering meals, transporting clients to medical appointments, providing Friendly Visiting and volunteering as a Foster Grandparent or Senior Companion. During our last fiscal year alone our volunteers drove over 175,000 miles and provided over 59,000 hours of care to our program participants. The proceeds from The Bird Auction are a valuable contribution to the success of all our volunteer programs.

We, at the Commission on Aging and our entire community are fortunate that individuals like Lois Breidenstein, her family and her staff live here. Their spirit of giving back to the community and supporting those in need should be commended by all of us.

Question: Heating my home has become a financial strain. I often wonder if I will have enough money to purchase propane all winter. If I do get behind in payments, are there programs that offer assistance?

Answer: If you find your self in need of assistance, one of the first things you should do is contact your utility company. Most of them already have programs in place to help customers in need, and they can help you establish a manageable budget plan to stop your utilities from being shut off. In addition, there are numerous public and private programs available for Isabella County residents. These programs may help with financial assistance towards your bill or energy savings tips that may lower your heating expenses.

FREE TAX PREPARATION AVAILABLE

The Isabella County Commission on Aging is once again coordinating with the AARP Tax-Aide program to assist area citizens by providing free income tax preparation with free effiling available. This service is provided to low and middle income taxpayers. Appointments for all sites except Dover Court, Riverview and Winchester Towers must be made by calling the Commission on Aging. Dover Court, Riverview and Winchester Towers should call their building office.

The volunteers at these tax clinics will be handling Federal and Michigan tax returns that are within the scope of their training, as well as Homestead Property Tax and Home Heating credits. Volunteers are required to pass an IRS test before they can prepare returns. People who are self employed, have rental property, large numbers of stock transactions or have sold property (other than their main home) should consult a paid professional tax preparer.
